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## "THE ROLE OF ENGLISH IN TRAINING TOUR GUIDES FOR ECOTOURISM IN UZBEKISTAN

Annotation

This article investigates the theoretical foundations of ecotourism with particular emphasis on the professional preparation of tour guides and the role of English as a key professional competence. Ecotourism is examined as a sustainable tourism model that combines environmental conservation, educational engagement, and intercultural communication. The study analyzes the conceptual principles of ecotourism, the current state of ecotourism development in Uzbekistan, and the professional roles and competencies required of ecotourism tour guides. Special attention is given to communication skills and English language proficiency as essential tools for effective interaction with international tourists. The article establishes a theoretical framework that justifies the integration of English language training into ecotourism guide education programs in Uzbekistan, highlighting the gap in certified eco-guides, and provides a foundation for further empirical research and policy recommendations.

## O'ZBEKISTONDA EKOTURIZM UCHUN TUR GIDLARINI TAYYORLASHDA INGLIZ TILINING O'RNI

Аннотация

Mazkur maqolada ekoturizmning nazariy asoslari va ushbu sohada faoliyat yurituvchi gidlarni kasbiy tayyorlash masalalari tahlil qilinadi. Ekoturizm barqaror turizm modeli sifatida atrof-muhitni muhofaza qilish, ekologik ta'lim va madaniyatlararo muloqotni uyg'unlashtiradi. Tadqiqotda O'zbekistonda ekoturizm rivojlanishining hozirgi holati, ushbu sohaning salohiyati hamda xalqaro sayyohlar bilan samarali ishlay oladigan malakali gidlar ehtiyoji yoritilgan. Ayniqsa, ingliz tilini bilish va kommunikativ kompetensiya ekoturizm gidlarining asosiy kasbiy talabi sifatida asoslab berilgan. Maqola O'zbekistonda ekoturizm bo'yicha gidlar tayyorlash o'quv dasturlariga ingliz tili o'qitilishini integratsiya qilishni asoslaydigan nazariy bazani yaratadi, sertifikatlangan ekogidrlarning mavjud bo'shliqlarini yoritib beradi hamda keyingi empirik tadqiqotlar va siyosiy tavsiyalar uchun zamin yaratadi.

## РОЛЬ АНГЛИЙСКОГО ЯЗЫКА В ПОДГОТОВКЕ ГИДОВ ДЛЯ ЭКОТУРИЗМА В УЗБЕКИСТАНЕ

Аннотация

В статье анализируются теоретические основы экотуризма и профессиональной подготовки гидов в сфере экотуризма. Экотуризм рассматривается как модель устойчивого туризма, сочетающая охрану окружающей среды, образовательную деятельность и межкультурную коммуникацию. Особое внимание уделяется развитию экотуризма в Узбекистане и возрастающей потребности в профессиональных гидах, владеющих английским языком. Подчеркивается, что коммуникативная компетенция и знание английского языка являются ключевыми профессиональными требованиями для гидов, работающих с международными туристами. Статья закладывает теоретическую основу, обосновывающую интеграцию обучения английскому языку в образовательные программы по подготовке гидов в сфере экотуризма в Узбекистане, подчеркивая существующий пробел в количестве сертифицированных экогидов, и обеспечивает фундамент для дальнейших эмпирических исследований и политических рекомендаций.

**Introduction.** In the modern era of global travel, ecotourism has emerged as a vital catalyst for sustainable economic growth and environmental conservation. Uzbekistan, situated at the heart of the Great Silk Road, possesses a diverse natural landscape ranging from the majestic peaks of the Western Tien-Shan to the unique ecosystems of the Kyzylkum Desert. Despite its immense potential, the country's ecotourism sector is currently navigating a transformative phase, balancing rapid infrastructure development with the preservation of its pristine biodiversity.

This research explores the current state of ecotourism in Uzbekistan, highlighting its untapped potential as a major contributor to the national economy. A central focus of the

study is the critical gap between the increasing influx of international visitors and the availability of specialized human resources. Specifically, it addresses the urgent need for professional ecotour guides – experts who not only possess multilingual proficiency but also master the intricacies of local flora, fauna, and sustainable outdoor management. By analyzing the synergy between environmental assets and professional training, this study aims to provide a roadmap for elevating Uzbekistan's position in the global ecotourism market.

**Methods and materials.** This study employs a qualitative research design combined with a descriptive-

analytical approach. To achieve the research objectives, the following methods were utilized:

**Literature review:** An extensive analysis of current global ecotourism standards and the existing legal-normative framework of tourism development in Uzbekistan.

**Comparative Analysis:** Evaluating the curriculum of tourism programs in national universities against international ESP (English for Specific Purposes) training models.

**Statistical Analysis:** Examination of data provided by the Tourism Committee and the Statistics Agency of Uzbekistan (2022–2024) regarding tourist inflows and guide certification categories.

**Gap Analysis:** Identifying the discrepancy between the linguistic competencies of current guides and the specialized ecological knowledge required by international ecotourists.

### Main Part

#### 1.1. Ecotourism as a Sustainable Tourism Model

Ecotourism has developed as a response to the environmental and socio-cultural challenges associated with mass tourism. In contrast to conventional tourism models, ecotourism emphasizes responsible travel practices that aim to preserve natural ecosystems while simultaneously supporting local communities. Scholars generally agree that ecotourism is defined not merely by destination type but by the ethical principles guiding tourist behavior and management practices.

A defining feature of ecotourism is its educational dimension. Tourists are encouraged to engage with natural environments in an informed and respectful manner, gaining knowledge about biodiversity, ecological processes, and conservation challenges. This educational function distinguishes ecotourism from recreational nature-based tourism and places a strong emphasis on interpretation and guided communication.

As a result, ecotourism is inherently dependent on human interaction. The success of ecotourism initiatives largely depends on individuals who can translate scientific and cultural knowledge into accessible and meaningful information for visitors. Within this context, tour guides play a central role.

#### 1.2. Ecotourism Development in the Context of Uzbekistan

Uzbekistan's ecological diversity—including mountainous zones, desert ecosystems, and protected natural territories—creates favorable conditions for the development of ecotourism-oriented activities such as trekking, wildlife observation, and environmental education tours. These landscapes represent a largely underutilized resource within the national tourism economy.

In recent policy discourse, tourism has been positioned as a strategic sector for economic diversification in Uzbekistan, with increasing emphasis on sustainability and environmental protection. Within this framework, ecotourism is recognized as a mechanism for attracting environmentally responsible international travelers while simultaneously minimizing ecological degradation.

Nevertheless, the expansion of ecotourism is constrained by structural limitations in human resource development. A particularly acute challenge is the shortage of guides who combine ecological expertise with professional-level foreign language proficiency. Given that English functions as the primary medium of international tourism communication, insufficient linguistic preparation significantly reduces the competitiveness of Uzbekistan's ecotourism services.

#### Statistical Overview and Professional Certification Trends (2022-2024)

"The dynamics of tourism in Uzbekistan show a significant recovery and growth phase. In 2023, the number of

foreign tourists visiting the republic reached 6.6 million, which is a 26.9% increase compared to 2022. According to the Tourism Committee, approximately 15-18% of these visitors expressed interest in nature-based activities, including trekking in the Western Tien-Shan and visiting the Aral Sea region.

However, the professional certification of guides specifically for ecotourism remains a bottleneck. As of early 2024, while there are over 2,500 certified guides in Uzbekistan, the vast majority (approx. 80%) are specialized in "historical and cultural heritage" (Silk Road cities like Samarkand and Bukhara). Only a small fraction—less than 10%—possess the specialized "Active Tourism" or "Ecotourism" certification. This statistical imbalance highlights the urgent need for a shift in training priorities to meet the demands of the growing number of environmental travelers" – published by Uzbekistan's Tourism Committee and Statistics Agency

#### 1.3. Professional Competencies of Ecotourism Tour Guides

The professional profile of an ecotourism guide extends beyond traditional guiding functions. In practice, guides are required to interpret natural heritage, foster environmentally responsible behavior, and facilitate intercultural dialogue between local communities and international visitors. These responsibilities necessitate an integrated set of competencies encompassing subject knowledge, ethical awareness, and advanced communication skills.

Among these competencies, communicative proficiency occupies a central position. Ecotourism guides must explain complex ecological concepts in a manner that is both scientifically accurate and accessible to non-specialist audiences. In international contexts, such interaction is predominantly conducted in English, which serves as the operational language of global ecotourism.

Therefore, English language competence should be conceptualized as a core professional qualification rather than a supplementary skill. Effective professional communication requires not only linguistic accuracy, but also pragmatic competence and intercultural sensitivity, particularly when addressing environmental issues that carry global significance.

#### 1.4. "Current Challenges in the Development of Ecotourism in Uzbekistan"

At the current stage of ecotourism development in Uzbekistan, several systemic barriers limit the sector's integration into the global tourism market. One of the most significant challenges is the insufficient interdisciplinary alignment within tourism education programs. Core natural science disciplines—such as ecology, botany, and zoology—are frequently underrepresented, which restricts guides' ability to deliver scientifically grounded interpretations in the field.

In addition, the absence of specialized pedagogical materials focused on field-based English communication further impedes professional growth. International ecotourists increasingly expect expert-level explanations of biodiversity, geological formations, and conservation practices. Addressing this demand requires the systematic incorporation of ESP-oriented modules that emphasize discipline-specific terminology and situational communication. Field-based training conducted in protected natural areas is essential for bridging theoretical knowledge with professional practice.

**1.5. Strategic Recommendations for Enhancing Ecotourism Training**Based on the identified challenges, the following strategies are proposed to elevate the professional standards of ecotourism guides in Uzbekistan:

**Curriculum Integration (ESP Focus):** Higher education institutions should implement specialized "English for Eco-

Guides" modules that prioritize biological, botanical, and geological terminology over general language skills.

**Field-Based Certification:** Establishing a mandatory field-practicum phase for certification, conducted in protected natural areas (e.g., Ugam-Chatkal National Park or Zaamin Reserve) to ensure guides can apply theoretical knowledge in real-world settings.

**Digital Competence Training:** Equipping guides with skills to use mobile applications for species identification (e.g., iNaturalist) and GPS navigation, enabling them to provide tech-savvy, interactive tours in English.

**Public-Private Partnerships:** Encouraging collaboration between state tourism bodies and international environmental NGOs to host "Master Classes" led by foreign ecological experts for local guides.

**Incentivizing Specialization:** Creating a distinct "Green Guide" license with higher professional status and financial incentives to encourage general guides to specialize in ecotourism

**Conclusion.** The theoretical analysis presented in this article unequivocally demonstrates that the development of ecotourism is fundamentally and inextricably linked to the core principles of sustainability, environmental education, and effective cross-cultural communication. Within the dynamic

context of Uzbekistan—a nation rapidly expanding its presence in the global tourism arena—this linkage has catalyzed an urgent and increasing demand for highly professionally trained tour guides who are adept at operating seamlessly in diverse international environments.

A critical finding emerging from this study is the pivotal role of English language proficiency. English is not merely a supplementary skill but an essential professional requirement that directly determines the quality, safety, and competitiveness of ecotourism services offered to the international market. The ability to communicate effectively in English enables guides to provide richer, more impactful educational experiences for tourists while adhering to global best practices in environmental stewardship.

Ultimately, the findings of this study provide a robust conceptual foundation for further empirical research and practical implementation. They underscore the necessity for the development of specialized, competency-based English language training programs specifically tailored to the unique demands of the ecotourism sector. This strategic investment in human capital is crucial for unlocking Uzbekistan's vast natural potential and positioning the country as a premier, sustainable ecotourism destination.

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
